

Spanish Club Scholarship in honor of Brett Carlson

He had a passion for the Spanish language and a love of travel. His interest in other cultures made him an interesting and effective teacher; students actually looked forward to his class. He went the extra mile to ensure that his students had fun learning and that each one felt important. He taught by example, in and out of the classroom. It is hoped that the recipients of the Brett Carlson Spanish Scholarship will perpetuate Brett's love of the Spanish language and his desire to be a positive influence in the lives of young people

Criteria to apply:

- Applicant **must** be a graduate or a graduating senior of LCHS interested in **pursuing a career consisting of Spanish speaking skills.**
- Applicant must submit three letters of recommendation.
- Application must be completed and filed with the LCHS guidance department by March 1st.
- Applicant must submit High school transcript.

If awarded the scholarship:

The following criteria will be considered when making a selection of the recipient of the Brett Carlson Scholarship.

- High school academic accomplishments of the applicant
- High moral and ethical standards
- Completion of at least two years of Spanish classes
- Basis of need

Labette County U.S.D. 506 shall serve as custodian of the scholarship account.

Previous scholarship recipients may apply to renew this award and will be considered along with senior applicants should said applicant have successfully completed all courses enrolled in during the previous school year. All other guidelines must be met.

This scholarship of \$500 could be awarded to more than one applicant per year, based on the number of applicants.

The scholarship(s) will be awarded at the Labette County High School awards assembly in May with the check(s) made payable to the college of the student's choice when proof of attendance has been shown.

In the event that the scholarship is not awarded or claimed by November 1 of the award year, it will render the scholarship offer null and void, and it shall be carried over to the next year.

The committee to determine the recipient(s) of the scholarship(s) shall be comprised as follows: Mr. And Mrs. Bob Carlson, parents of Brett, a guidance counselor from LCHS, the LCHS Spanish instructor, the U.S.D. 506 clerk of the Board of Education, and teachers, past and present, that were close friends of Mr. Carlson.
