

LCHS Girls Basketball Shine in Sub-State

After splitting two games during the regular season, the Lady Grizzlies showed their SEK League dominance, trouncing the Fort Scott Tigers 49–41 in the finals of the 4A Sub–State tournament on March 4th.

After a rough first quarter, the Grizzlies outscored the Tigers 15-4 in the second to end the first half leading 20-15.

It was all Labette County in the second half, and the Grizzlies punched their ticket to Salina and the KSHSAA 4A state tournament.

The Lady Grizzly basketball team went into the state tournament with high hopes of a win against Wamego. Unfortunately they fell one bucket short of that goal, losing to the Red Raiders 36–34. The Grizzlies took command in the first half, leading 21–14 at halftime. But a lone three pointer in the third quarter and earlier fouls lead to starters sitting and Wamego gaining ground, leading by one at the start of the fourth quarter.

With the game tied 34-34 with 20 seconds left, a turnover led to a pair of free throws that sealed the Grizzlies fate.

Madison Brannin led the Grizzlies with 13 points. The team finished with a record of 18-5. Way to go, Lady Grizzlies!


2nd Graders learn that Matter matters


3rd Graders Build Skiers

We reached out to Chief Barnes, a former Edna Wildcat, and he graciously accepted our invitation to share his expertise on Shawnee culture.

Grant helps Edna 3rd Graders with Phonics

The Edna 3rd graders were excited to use their new phonics kits purchased through the 506 Foundation Grant. They received 10 new kits to complete a class set. That allows each student to have their own boards to work on phonics and spelling each week rather than sharing in the past. We are so grateful to receive this grant.

6th Graders Paint Solar Eclipses

6th grade students are finishing up our unit on The Earth-Sun-Moon System by painting a solar eclipse on t-shirts. They compared patterns of the apparent motion of the sun, moon & stars. Understanding this helps them predict lunar phases, eclipses of the sun and moon, and seasons.





Students Study Plant Breakdown

Students have been learning about producers, consumers, and decomposers. Ava holds two decomposing pears. They observed a pear decomposing in sand, soil, and water. Students concluded that the pear decomposed faster in the soil because the soil contained microorganisms which broke down the pear.

7th Graders learn with Potatoes

Seventh graders studied types of reproduction in their biology class. They grew potatoes in a cup to observe how the potato uses budding to reproduce asexually.
